REACH Scholarship Program Growing

Jennifer Herring, Senior VP for College Affordability Initiatives for the Georgia Student Finance Commission (GSFC), is excited about the growth and the potential of the REACH (Realizing Educational Achievement Can Happen) Scholarship Program in encouraging and supporting young scholars as they progress from middle school, through high school, and into college. Students undergo a rigorous selection process to become part of the REACH Program. Once in the program, they must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5, a clean discipline record, and have a strong attendance record. The "carrot" at the end of the high school experience is a \$10,000 scholarship to attend University System of Georgia schools, Technical Colleges, or participating private schools in Georgia. Students are also required to meet regularly with academic coaches and a mentor in the local community. Herring likened the program to "local communities reaching out and wrapping their arms around these students."

Brad Bryant, VP with the REACH Georgia Office, explained that funding the program is a cooperative arrangement between the Georgia state legislature, the GSFC, and the local community. REACH began in 3 school districts in 2012. This fall, 103 of the 180 districts in Georgia will be participating with 1200 scholars enrolled. The first class recently graduated from their respective high schools with some impressive statistics. Of those 17 graduates, they maintained an average GPA of 3.51, 15 were HOPE eligible, all graduated on time or ahead of schedule, and all are college bound (2 to technical colleges, 14 to USG schools, 1 to Emory). Our local Griffin-Spalding School System will be one of those 103 participating districts this fall. **Dr. Tommy Hopkins**, USG Board of Regents Chair, introduced the 5 rising 8th-grade students who have been accepted in the REACH Program here. They are **Carlos Alvarez** (Cowan Road Middle), **Diego Deliz** (Rehobeth Road Middle), **Thavious Neal** (Rehobeth Road Middle), **Marcolya Sutton** (Kennedy Road Middle), and **Emily VanEps** (Carver Road Middle). These 5 students were selected from a pool of 148 applicants. In closing, Herring and Bryant outlined their wish list for the future of REACH in Georgia including involvement of all 180 school districts in the state, securing necessary funding to insure long-term sustainability, and increasing student enrollment in the program. Bryant noted that civic clubs that give high school seniors small scholarships might reconsider and invest those dollars into the REACH Program where the same investment will have even greater impact.
